I'm delighted to report that our post school destination statistics have increased again this year, rising from 89.22% of young people transitioning into a positive destination last year, to 93.13% this year. The percentage of young people transitioning into Further Education and Higher Education has increased as has the percentage moving into training opportunities. We will continue to work hard with our partners in order that the percentage continues to increase in the coming years.




Attendance at school
