## **Head Teacher Update**



I hope this weekly update finds you and your families well.

It's hard to believe that this is the final weekly update of 2023, where does the time go. Next week we will share our Winter Newsletter with parents / carers and the wider community and this newsletter will showcase the work that has taken place across the school during term 1 and term 2 of this session.

This week myself and the Depute Head Teachers had the pleasure of listening to our S5 pupils who are following the Youth Philanthropy Initiative as part of their Religious and Moral Education curriculum, deliver presentations in support of their chosen local charity. The standard of presentations was excellent and it was difficult to select which groups will progress to the final which will be held in the new year with the winning charity receiving £3000. The young people will find out soon who has progressed to the final. Well done to everyone involved.

Below you will find a reminder about our end of term events. On the last day of term (Wednesday 20 December) our young people are invited to either dress down in non-uniform or dress up for Christmas by wearing Christmas jumpers, tinsel etc. We are hoping to make a large donation to the Kirkcaldy Foodbank on the 20 December and ask that in exchange for either 'dressing down' or 'dressing up for Christmas', young people bring an item of non-perishable food, toiletries or a monetary donation of £1 (or whatever they can afford). The Kirkcaldy Foodbank are also appealing for carrier bags, so if you have any of these lying around at home that you don't need, please encourage your young person to bring them into school. All of the food items should be passed to registration teachers or the school office, stating clearly which House group the young person is in as

each item will equal one house point. Please give generously if you can and thank you in advance for your support.

### **Prelim Examinations**



The Prelim Exams begin on Friday 5th of January and end on Friday 19th January. Young people should look carefully at their prelim timetables and highlight the days and times of their exams, being aware that they may have more than one exam per day. All young people should be ready to enter the exam hall 10 minutes prior to the start time of their exam and have noted their seat number (the seat number is likely to be different for each exam). If their exam begins during lunchtime, they will be entitled to an early lunch. If a young person has assessment arrangements, Mrs Hill will provide them with an individual timetable which will state the start and end time of their exam and which room this will take place in.

No mobile phones or smart watches should be taken into the exam hall. These can either be handed to a member of staff or locked in the classroom where bags and jackets will be stored.

Pupils should follow their normal timetable when not in an exam and registers will be taken both at the beginning of exams and in classes as normal. School uniform should be worn as normal.

## Support over the school holidays

The Christmas holidays can be a challenging time for many families, especially given the current Cost of Living Crisis. There are, however, a number of supports that are out there which can help and we've listed some of these below for your information.

### Our Fife - Support with the Cost of Living

This team provide help for those who aren't eligible for any benefits. Some of the support which is offered is universal, meaning anyone can get it. You can reach them at this webpage Cost of Living Support <sup>1</sup> (our.fife.scot/gethelp) or on this number 0800 9520330.

#### **Cosy Kingdom**

This team provide specific help for those who need support heating their home. You can call 01592 807930 or text "Cosy" to 88440.

#### **Food Bank Availability**

The Link Living Foodback is open every day, 10 am to 4.30pm during the holidays apart from the 25th and 26th December. It is referral only, so you will need a support worker to make a referral on your behalf. This can include a social worker, housing officer or our Family Support Worker her at Viewforth. Viewforth Church Foodbank is also available and accepts walk ins without a referral. It is open 27th and 28th December 10am - 3pm.

#### **Mental Health Supports**

#### **Samaritans**

They are available on 116123 and they provide phoneline support for anyone needing to speak about their mental health who may be in crisis. Shout Crisis Provide a text line on 85258 for anyone needing to speak about their mental health who may be in crisis. If you are under 19 and wish to use the service text "YM" as there is a specific team which deals with this age group.LGBT+ There is also an LGBT+ specific helpline to provide mental health support on 0800 4647000.




There are a variety of ways you can contact the school and we would encourage you to get in touch if you have any questions or concerns.
