Preparation for SQA Exams



Our Easter Study programme has now been finalised and you can find the detail of this below. Please encourage your young person to attend the sessions relevant to them as this will allow them to engage with a subject specialist and ask any questions they may have. Pupils should sign in and out at the school office and bring snacks, water etc with them as the school café is closed during the holidays. Pupils are of course welcome to wear casual clothes and school uniform is not required.

We have also finalised our SQA Masterclass timetable (below). Attendance at Masterclass sessions will support young people with final preparations in advance of each exam, allowing them to speak with subject specialists and ask any last minute questions they may have. Please encourage your young person to attend the Masterclasses as this will give them the best chance of success. School uniform should be worn during these sessions.

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Registration for e-Sgoil's Study Support is Open!



In addition to our own Easter Study Support programme, the e-Sgoil webinar programme is a key element of Scotland's National e-Learning Offer (NeLO). It comprises of live, interactive webinars delivered by experienced, GTCS registered teachers.

A total of 74 webinars are on offer, covering 31 subjects at different levels. Each webinar group will meet for three sessions during **2 – 11 April 2024**. This provision is **free** to all learners.

Last Easter, there were over 16,000 webinar registrations and almost all learners rated the overall quality of the Easter Study Support as "excellent". The timetable, registration form, and a range of supporting documentation can all be accessed here.¹

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OSIRIS - Staff Training



Last week saw the conclusion of the Osiris Teacher Intervention programme which a group of teaching staff have been engaged with. The final session involved a sharing of the learning that had taken place focusing on Feedback, Agency, Challenge and Engagement which are four key components of high quality teaching and learning. The group shared their specific areas of research and development through presentations reflecting on the impact the course has had on the learning within their classrooms. The group really enjoyed working with the Osiris team and the opportunity to explore learning and teaching in depth and detail. We will continue to collaborate with the Osiris team next session when a new cohort of staff will have the opportunity to engage with the programme.

EtLoL Staff Training



This week also saw the culmination of the Excellence through Leadership of Learning programme that members of the school's Extended Leadership Team have been engaged with. The programme explored the strategic leadership of learning and explored the importance of shared clarity, relational trust and accurate self perception. The learning complements that of the Outstanding Teaching Intervention programme and collectively the programmes will support collegiate working in our pursuit of consistently high-quality teaching, learning and assessment. The school will continue to collaborate with Osiris Education with a second cohort of colleagues engaging in the programme next session.

Café Inc



Café Inc is back across Fife during the Easter holidays for children and young people under 18. Café Inc makes sure that the Kingdom's children and young people will have at least one tasty and healthy meal while our nurseries and schools are closed during the holidays. There's no need to book, you can just turn up. All we ask is that children under 10 are accompanied by an adult, who can also have a meal. Breakfast Club

After the Easter holiday we are changing the start time of our breakfast club to 8.30am. A reminder that all young people are welcome to come into school at this time to enjoy breakfast before the day starts at 8.46am. Pupils should remain outside the campus until 8.30am.

Cost of the school day



As a school we work to ensure that all young people can attend without having to worry about the cost of anything in school. This also includes things that they might need to help them attend school. There are a range of services we offer that all young people are welcome to use.

- Breakfast Club open from 8.20 8.40 daily in the school café
- Sanitary Products our Support Hub have a range of sanitary products that are free to take if needed. Many classrooms have these in class as well for young people to help themselves.
 These are signposted in the classes.
- School uniform the Support Hub has a range of uniform that young people are welcome to have if needed. This includes shirts, trousers, tights, socks and jerseys among other items.
 Whilst pupils can ask themselves, if parents would prefer, they can phone and ask for this support on their young person's behalf.
- Toiletries we also hold a stock of toiletries for anyone who may need them this includes shampoo, shower gel, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes.
- All families who are eligible, are encouraged to apply for free school meals. You can check your eligibility and to apply via this link: Free school meals and school clothing grants | Fife Council⁵
- Also, your child may be eligible to apply for Educational Maintenance Allowance if they are over 16. You can check eligibility and apply via this link: Education Maintenance Allowance | Fife Council⁶
- S4-6 students are also reminded that there is a stock of study materials held in the Depute Head Teachers' office that they are welcome to use. This includes cue cards, post-it notes, highlighters and resource guides.




There are a variety of ways you can contact the school and we would encourage you to get in touch if you have any questions or concerns.
