Head Teacher Update



I hope this update finds you and your families well.

The SQA exam diet for this session is almost complete and we have one exam left on Tuesday of next week, which is Art and Design. All senior pupils who are returning for next session are expected to be in school on Friday 31st May for their Senior Phase Induction. They should report to the assembly hall in full school uniform for 8.46am.

Pupils in S3 will receive their reports on Tuesday 28 May during period 7. If your child is absent on the day, the can collect their report from the school office the following day.

This year's Achievement Awards ceremony will take place on Thursday 20 June. You will receive an invitation over the coming weeks if your child has been nominated for an award. More information to follow.

A reminder that there is a school holiday on Monday 3 June and the school will be closed to pupils and staff.

Finally, please remember that not only does our timetable change on Tuesday 4 June, but our school week does too. Here you will find a copy of the school week to help you learn the new times. Please note that the school day starts sharp at 8.40am and pupils should be ready to report to their period 1 class at this time.

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



Extra-Curricular Taster Morning

This week we welcomed our incoming S1 pupils for an 'extra curricular taster morning', the last transition event in school prior to the two day visit in June. Pupils were offered the opportunity to participate in a range of activities and clubs, meet with pupils from other schools who share similar interests and build relationships with new friends and staff. The activities on offer were Music Club,

Science Club, Drama Club, Fitness Club, Football, School of Basketball, Dance and Maths Puzzles. The feedback from staff and pupils alike was very positive and there was a real buzz about all sessions. We look forward to building on these experiences in August when many of these clubs will be available on a weekly basis.

Principal Teacher Seminar

Principal Teachers of Curriculum enjoyed a collegiate seminar this week which focussed on improvements in learning, teaching and assessment. The seminar involved identifying the key features of high-quality teaching and learning and planning for learning, including reviewing our approach to learning visits. The team discussed achieving shared clarity around the learning experience and the effective leadership of learning through professional dialogue focussed on continued improvement in learning teaching and assessment. The seminar was very positive and allowed the extended leadership team to share good practice and identify collective priorities for improvement.

Senior Phase Induction

Friday 31st May will see the return of our S5/6 pupils as the SQA exam diet draws to a close. They, along with S4 pupils, will receive an induction to ensure they are prepared to make the most of the opportunities available in their senior years of school. The induction will prepare them for the expectations of life in the senior phase. All young people returning for their senior years should ensure they are in full school uniform, have something to write with and be ready to engage in range of activities throughout the day. Pupils will be given their timetables, take part in goal setting and planning, complete team building exercises and receive a presentation from a community charity leader on actions of effective leaders and supporting the work of teams.

Social Work Senior Practitioner

We are pleased to welcome Kim Gilmartin to the Support Team here at Viewforth HS. Viewforth is part of a pilot scheme across Fife where senior practitioners from social work, work within High Schools. Kim will work alongside the guidance and support for pupils team on planning supports for young people and families. She will also be working with families on a range of matters that support increased engagement with school and promote wellbeing for the young person and their families. Cost of the school day



As a school we work to ensure that all young people can attend without having to worry about the cost of anything in school. This also includes things that they might need to help them attend school. There are a range of services we offer that all young people are welcome to use.

- Breakfast Club open from 8.20 8.40 daily in the school café
- Sanitary Products our Support Hub have a range of sanitary products that are free to take if needed. Many classrooms have these in class as well for young people to help themselves.
 These are signposted in the classes.
- School uniform the Support Hub has a range of uniform that young people are welcome to have if needed. This includes shirts, trousers, tights, socks and jerseys among other items.
 Whilst pupils can ask themselves, if parents would prefer, they can phone and ask for this support on their young person's behalf.
- Toiletries we also hold a stock of toiletries for anyone who may need them this includes shampoo, shower gel, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes.
- All families who are eligible, are encouraged to apply for free school meals. You can check your eligibility and to apply via this link: Free school meals and school clothing grants | Fife Council⁴
- Also, your child may be eligible to apply for Educational Maintenance Allowance if they are over 16. You can check eligibility and apply via this link: Education Maintenance Allowance | Fife Council⁵
- S4-6 students are also reminded that there is a stock of study materials held in the Depute Head Teachers' office that they are welcome to use. This includes cue cards, post-it notes, highlighters and resource guides.
- Whilst all young people are encouraged to come equipped for school with their own pens and pencils, if they need anything like this they can be provided at school.

If you, or your child, have any concerns around costs associated with school you are welcome to contact the school and speak with their Principal Teacher of Guidance.

Ms Harris will support 3C1, 3C2 and 4C1






There are a variety of ways you can contact the school and we would encourage you to get in touch if you have any questions or concerns.
