# **Head Teacher Update**



I hope this update finds you and your families well.

Today we welcome our senior pupils back to school after the SQA exam period. The seniors will participate in their Senior Phase Induction, learning more about the leadership opportunities available to them, participating in team building activities and working with peers on a range of challenges. Their new timetables will be shared and they will told about our new Digital Devices policy which begins on Tuesday of next week.

Yesterday our S1 - S3 pupils received their new timetables in advance of the timetable changing next week. If your child was absent yesterday, they can collect this from the support hub today or from any of the Deputes on Tuesday. The S1 - S3 pupils also had assemblies focused on the new Digital Device policy, the change to the school week which begins on Tuesday and uniform expectations for next session. Our Bronze Duke of Edinburgh participants completed their practice expedition on Monday and Tuesday, walking and camping along the Fife Coastal Path. The young people did incredibly well and although tired, were in high spirits and really enjoyed the experience. Our Silver Duke of Edinburgh participants completed their training day in advance of their silver expedition and despite the torrential rain this week, both groups were incredibly lucky with the weather.

The Art department have been very busy with Ms Gibb leading a Junk Couture experience for pupils in S1 - S3. This is a global challenge and the day provided young people with an insight into what the challenge entails before we launch the Junk Couture club next session. By the end of the day, the pupils had created two outfits - one out of newspaper and the second out of recyclable junk. On Wednesday, members of the Art department led a trip for senior pupils to the Duncan of Jordanstone Degree Show in Dundee. The young people also had the opportunity to visit the V&A Kimono exhibition. What a great day with lots of learning.

# **Digital Device Policy**



The Digital Device Policy will begin on Tuesday 4 June. The policy is being implemented as we are aware of how much of a distraction mobile phones are to learning. We are seeing a number of instances where parents are calling their children when they are in classes. We would ask parents to phone during break and lunchtimes so that lessons aren't disrupted. # **Online Safety**



Mobile phones are a great way for children and young people to keep in contact with their parents, carers and friends, especially as they begin a new school year. However, issues may arise if our children and young people excitedly share their mobile phone number with other pupils in their new school year group and even wider, as they perhaps join 'WhatsApp' group chats or other social media group chats.

This can lead to your child or young person sharing their mobile phone number with a whole year group and being included in what could amount to over one hundred school pupils on single group chat! The reality of this is that they don't all know each other, they will all be from different backgrounds, they will all have different levels of online awareness and they will most likely be seeing messages, images and even video footage shared in the group which you, as a parent or carer, would not like them to see but which is out with your control. This situation can be difficult to manage and could be distressing in relation to what is read or seen. Coupled to this, peer pressure could lead to bullying.

WhatsApp is by far the most used messaging App although there are many other similar messaging Apps, and it allows users to send instant messages only to contacts that they have added to their WhatsApp account. Only people who have a WhatsApp account can send and receive messages through the app. Messages can be sent 'one to one' or within a 'group conversation' and for all messages sent, WhatsApp sends "read receipts" to tell sender if the message was delivered, read, seen or played. These settings can be changed, see the 'how to guide for parents' link below for more information. In relation to a group chat on any social media platform, even those as a parent or carer you are involved with, you have no control what will be sent, seen or shared so it is worthwhile having a conversation with your child or young person about this.

We know peer pressure can lead to people of any age doing something they otherwise would not do, online or offline, so this awareness during your child or young persons' early years is very important.

Our colleagues at Internet Matters have created information resources below to inform you of how the social media platform "WhatsApp" operates and how you can you can put measures in place to protect what your child or young person sees on the app and awareness on the apps security settings.

# Cost of the school day



As a school we work to ensure that all young people can attend without having to worry about the cost of anything in school. This also includes things that they might need to help them attend school. There are a range of services we offer that all young people are welcome to use.

- Breakfast Club open from 8.20 8.40 daily in the school café
- Sanitary Products our Support Hub have a range of sanitary products that are free to take if needed. Many classrooms have these in class as well for young people to help themselves.
   These are signposted in the classes.
- School uniform the Support Hub has a range of uniform that young people are welcome to have if needed. This includes shirts, trousers, tights, socks and jerseys among other items.
   Whilst pupils can ask themselves, if parents would prefer, they can phone and ask for this support on their young person's behalf.
- Toiletries we also hold a stock of toiletries for anyone who may need them this includes shampoo, shower gel, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes.
- All families who are eligible, are encouraged to apply for free school meals. You can check
  your eligibility and to apply via this link: Free school meals and school clothing grants | Fife
  Council<sup>2</sup>

- Also, your child may be eligible to apply for Educational Maintenance Allowance if they are over 16. You can check eligibility and apply via this link: Education Maintenance Allowance | Fife Council<sup>3</sup>
- S4-6 students are also reminded that there is a stock of study materials held in the Depute Head Teachers' office that they are welcome to use. This includes cue cards, post-it notes, highlighters and resource guides.
- Whilst all young people are encouraged to come equipped for school with their own pens and pencils, if they need anything like this they can be provided at school.

If you, or your child, have any concerns around costs associated with school you are welcome to contact the school and speak with their Principal Teacher of Guidance.




There are a variety of ways you can contact the school and we would encourage you to get in touch if you have any questions or concerns.
